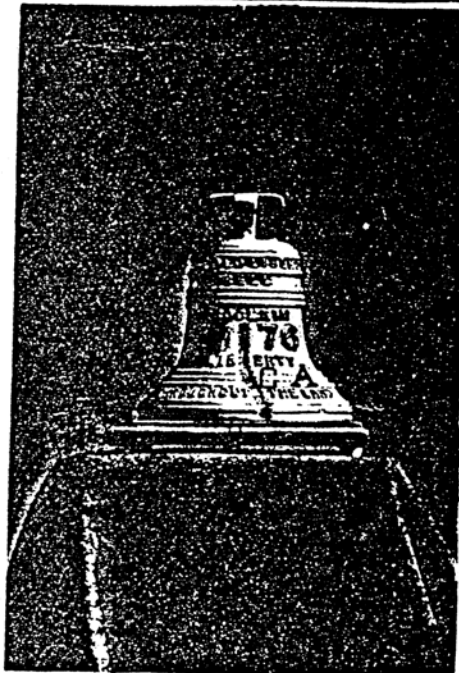

DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,257**, dated April 6, 1875; application filed March 19, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS A. BAILEY, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Money-Bank, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustrations, to which reference is made.

A represents a bell on a stand or base, B. On the obverse side of the bell are the words and figures, "Centennial Money-Bank, 1876." On the reverse side are the words and figures

"The Old Liberty-Bell, 1776. Proclaim Liberty Throughout the Land," and a line, C, representing a crack.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a money-bank, substantially as shown and described.
